Employment and Economic Response to COVID-19 Daily Digest -- Thursday, March 19

State guidance for small businesses - while restaurants, bars and other establishments that offer food or beverages for sale are restricted to carry-out or delivery, the state has guidance for other types of small businesses. The state urges these businesses to assess their practices, implement strong social distancing measures, and close their doors temporarily if they cannot put the new guidance in place. The state also urges businesses to keep the health and safety of Oregonians at the forefront as they make hard business decisions. Oregon adopts temporary changes to Child Care Rules in response to COVID-19 state of emergency

Many people are contacting the Oregon Employment Department and asking if WorkSource Centers are open to walk-in customers during this time of closures and social distancing. While the situation could change day-to-day, the centers remain open as of Thursday, March 19. Staff and customers are asked to take some simple health precautions, which includes limiting the number of customers at any given time and adhering to social distancing protocols. The Oregon Employment Department has timely information on <u>unemployment insurance related to COVID-19</u>.

The Oregon Employment Department also has adopted <u>temporary rules</u> for unemployment insurance benefits flexibility and issued a <u>news release</u> related to COVID-19 and layoffs, closures and unemployment insurance. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) retooled to help respond to the spread of infectious disease: Grantees may use Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for a range of eligible activities that prevent and respond to the spread of infectious diseases, including COVID-19. https://files.hudexchange.info/resources/documents/Quick-Guide-CDBG-Infectious-Disease-Response.pdf **More on land use decisions subject to the 120 and 150 day rules in ORS 227.178 and ORS 215.427:** The statutory time limits for local land use authorities to decide applications is causing some anxiety at the local level. The state is exploring options to temporarily suspend the 120 and 150-day time clocks, though how and whether this will happen is uncertain. Meanwhile, the Department of Land Conservation and Development asks local land use authorities to contact all current development review applicants and request that they provide a written waiver of the 120 or 150-day requirement. Jurisdictions that are compelled to hold a public hearing on a land use application should consider hearings via teleconference.
