The City, together with many local community partners, continue to come alongside Sharing Hands Food Bank to help feed those in need. Our community partners include our local Faith Community, the Calapooia Food Alliance, the Brownsville Rural Fire District, the Senior Center, and the American Legion. These groups are busy helping and sharing resources to ease the burden being felt by Sharing Hands Food Bank. Still, more help is needed through volunteering and donations.

As the State rolls out it's Reopening Plan, confusion has led to indecision and frustration. Hopefully, over the next two weeks things will become more clear. The Chamber and other civic partners have postponed and cancelled events. Others are waiting to see if restrictions will be lifted. Stay tuned!

Pioneer Park is closed to camping, but will be monitored to determine when camping can resume. The Park Caretakers will start next week. Cleaning protocols and summer tasks will keep them busy.

Public Works continues to serve by providing clean water, fixing water and sewer lines, completing reports and preparing for the summer.

The budget process was held by teleconference this year due to the pandemic. Overall, the process worked well. Council will hold a budget hearing on May 26th, 2020 for additional public comments and input.

A note from Team Alyrica

We have been busy getting Brownsville ready for fiber optic internet. We have been working in many neighborhoods throughout town. Many people are curious about which addresses are coming online first and what the process is. The project is running cabling to homes and businesses (we call them 'drop lines'). Getting a drop line to your house does not mean that you are required to sign up with Alyrica for fiber optic internet or any of our other services, but if you are interested in getting the drop line now, we will do it for **free** as our team will already be in the area during the main construction, no strings attached. The price for getting a drop line **after** we complete these initial drop line installs will be \$450.

Before we can bring a drop line to your home, we ask that you to fill out the "Fiber Optic Utility Agreement" (found here: https://www.alyrica.net/wp-content/uploads/2020/05/FUA.pdf) and return it to us. If you do not own your home, your landlord will have to fill out the form. The filled-out form will serve as permission for us to drill a drop line from our main line to a network box that we will install outside your house. The process from start to finish for getting fiber optic internet to your address is:

As we move the process ahead, getting these Utility Agreements back from the property owners is especially important and we thank you ahead of time for helping us bring the best customer experience in telecommunications to Brownsville! Please let us know if you have any questions.
