

My heart weeps for our nation.

Perpetrators must be prosecuted and held accountable for their actions, regardless of the political persuasion of either the victim or the target. The rule of law must prevail.

Heinous killings and acts of violence do not have to define who we are in a nation. I firmly believe the vast majority of Americans are horrified by this wave of unprecedented violence. There is far more that unites us than divides us.

Our nation needs to heal. We need to open our hearts once again and make our way back to our common humanity. To get from behind the computer screen and get to the kitchen table or the town square to discuss our differences. **To agree to disagree.** This is the legacy of Charlie Kirk.

A young man's life was cut short. A young wife is now a widow. Two children are now without a father. He was killed for just doing his job and having an opinion that some happen to find offensive.

Today, I pray for our country. Today, I mourn for the Kirk family.

Tomorrow, I will show up to discuss, debate, and represent many of the values Charlie espoused in a civil and respectful manner, working to persuade my fellow Oregonians and Americans that those values are the ones that will provide us security, prosperity, and hope for the future of the nation.
